

Coordinated Community Review Team (CCRT)

Coordinated Community Review Team for Sexual and Gender-Based Violence and Misconduct Overview:

In response to the recommendations from the University of California President's Task Force on Preventing and Responding to Sexual Violence and Sexual Assault, the Chancellor replaced the Title IX Compliance Advisory Committee in July 2015 with a new broad based community membership and structure. Each UC campus was required to appoint a Coordinated Community Review Team for Sexual and Gender-Based Violence and Misconduct (CCRT).

The newly constituted CCRT committee launched its kick off meeting with 40 plus members in September 2015. The role of the committee is to serve in an advisory capacity to campus leadership and community members about policy, best practices, education, prevention and response to sexual misconduct. The configuration of the committee encompasses a wide and diverse representation of functions from across the campus and the community as well as student representation (see roster; <https://compliance.berkeley.edu/sites/default/files/ccrtroster061416.pdf>).

The committee is Co-Chaired by Jeffrey Edleson, Dean and Professor of the School of Social Welfare, and Wanda Ellison Crockett, Deputy Associate Chancellor who organized the committee into strategic groups on Sexual Violence-Sexual Harassment (SVSH) initiatives:

- Policy
- Education & Prevention
- Complaint Resolution

The working groups collaborate closely with the Directors of the Office for the Prevention of Harassment and Discrimination (OPHD) and the Office of Sexual Assault Prevention & Student Advocacy that are led by Denise Oldham and Mari Knuth-Bouracee respectively. The committee meets at a minimum quarterly and is comprised of experts in the field that bear the responsibility for driving messages about campus and community efforts to prevent and respond to sexual misconduct. Student representation, interaction and input in these endeavors is



essential in the development of policy, prevention strategies and improving the educational process in SVSH. In essence, the essential role of this team is to advance the campus efforts to communicate about campus initiatives and activities aimed at preventing and responding to sexual misconduct.
